IMD predicts abovenormal monsoon rainfall

News Kolkata: The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has delivered encouraging news for the upcoming monsoon season, forecasting above-normal rainfall across the country. According to the latest bulletin, India is expected to receive 5% more rainfall than the seasonal average, a development that bodes well for the agricultural sector, particularly in monsoon-dependent regions like West Bengal.

Meteorologists also suggest that Bengal, too, is likely to experience higher-than-usual rainfall this year. Farmers across the state have welcomed the forecast with optimism, hoping for a robust monsoon that would boost paddy production and improve overall yield. Consistent and ample rainfall is critical for rice cultivation, and a favorable monsoon often translates to a stronger rural economy.

In the short term, the weather department has forecast scattered thunderstorms accompanied by lightning and light to moderate rainfall in several districts of western Bengal. These include East and West Midnapore, Jhargram, Purulia, Bankura, and West Burdwan. No severe storm activity is expected, although occasional gusty winds are likely.

Service, Thursday, while South Bengal, including Kolkata, may witness an increase in rainfall on Thursday and Friday. The IMD has warned of sporadic thunderstorm activity with wind speeds reaching 30 to 50 km/h during this period.

India is likely to receive 'above normal' monsoon rainfall, or 5% more than the historical average of 87 cm, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) said on Tuesday (April 15, 2025). Were this to bear out, it would be a second year of 'above normal' rains

Kolkata recorded a minimum temperature of 24°C on Monday, with the day's maximum temperature climbing to 34.7°C. The relative humidity in the city hovered between 45% and 91%, contributing to a sultry atmosphere.

Despite the pre-monsoon fluctuations, the overall outlook remains positive. The possibility of above-average monsoon rains is expected to alleviate water scarcity concerns and improve groundwater levels, especially in rural zones that have been grappling with prolonged dry spells.

The IMD's early monsoon forecast serves as a beacon of hope for the agrarian community and policy planners alike. Bike car collision fatal for couple

Service, Purulia: A fatal road accident in Purulia claimed the lives of a couple after their bike collided with a car. Responding to local reports. Balrampur police rescued the severely injured couple and transported them to a local health center, where they succumbed to their injuries. The car driver remains at large, and police have launched an investigation, including questioning eyewitnesses.

A fatal road accident in Purulia's Balrampur area resulted in the deaths of a couple on Wednesday. Local residents reported a collision between a motorcycle and a four-wheeler to the authorities. Upon arrival, officers from the Balrampur Police Station found the couple in critical condition and immediately transported them to the Block Primary Health Center. Despite medical intervention, attending physicians pronounced both individuals deceased. Subsequent to the incident, the driver of the four-wheeler absconded from the scene. The police have initiated a search operation to locate the individual and are currently questioning local residents to gather further information. The involved vehicle has been impounded as part of the ongoing investigation. Eyewitness Salim Ansari stated, "The motorcycle had penetrated deeply into the vehicle. We promptly informed the police, who arrived swiftly to extricate the injured and transport them to the hospital." The police investigation is currently underway to ascertain the circumstances leading to the collision and to apprehend the driver of the four-wheeler.

Minor girl allegedly harassed, accused arrested following mob justice

Fellow passengers and locals reportedly forced the accused off the bus and assaulted him before police intervened and made an arrest. occurred A Wednesday morning commute on a crowded Bankura-Tata passenger bus was disrupted when a minor girl, a class eight student en route to tuition in Raipur, was allegedly subjected to indecent behavior by a fellow male passenger. The incident, which occurred near the Raipur traffic intersection in Bankura, sparked immediate outrage among passengers and local res-

Evewitness accounts indicate that a commotion erupted on the bus following the girl's distress. Subsequently, the accused young man was forcibly removed from the vehicle and reportedly assaulted by agitated passengers and locals. Upon receiving information about the incident, officers from Raipur Police Station arrived at the scene and apprehended the accused.

According to local sources, the student alighted from the bus in tears at the Raipur traffic junction and disclosed the alleged harassment she experienced during the journey. This revelation incited the gathered crowd, leading to the physical altercation with the accused. Police have confirmed the arrest and stated that efforts are currently underway to ascertain the identity of the individual in custody. Further investigation into the allegations is ongoing.

Thief returns stolen iPhone after change of heart

Siliguri: A bizarre in-Siliguri, where a thief, after stealing an expensive iPhone, surprisingly returned it to the owner's doorstep a month later.
